'Magic Moments'

F2 – have made us very proud this week with such a fantastic performance at their first ever Sports Day. With so many instructions to follow, new sights and sounds and a huge audience watching, they well and truly took it all in their stride.

Year 1 – This week Year 1 have been learning about time: days of the week, months of the year and hours, minutes and seconds. They have also looked closely at pictures of St Barnabas Church in Bromborough and begun to make their own sketches of it, concentrating on the shapes that they can see in the picture and transferring them to their own paper.

Year 2- This week has been great to see everyone in the class working so well as a team to have such a brilliant Sports Day. The children were respectful when winning and losing. It was so lovely to see the winners celebrating, whilst being considerate of others. Also, the other teams congratulating those who won their races and the competition!

Year 3 – Our week has been a very sporty and mathematical week. We loved a full day of sports activities on Wednesday including speed bounce, long jump, javelin and welly wanging. We have learnt that angles are a measurement of turn and that they can be identified as acute, obtuse or right angles. We have made our own





3D shapes using nets and created art inspired by the artist Mondrian to learn about perpendicular, parallel, horizontal and vertical lines.

Year 4 – We have been learning about the Vikings. We viewed the Viking era on a timeline and were surprised to see how short it was compared to other civilisations that we have studied. We also competed with respect and exuberance in our Sports Day.

Year 5 – This week we have been learning what life was like for working Victorian children. We discovered some of the terrible jobs that they had to do to survive. We then had to decide which job we would have liked the most to do, to the least. Most of us decided we did not want to be rat catchers! This lesson has helped prepare us for our trip to Liverpool next week.

Year 6 – This week Year 6 have started designing very basic video games that the will be going on to code and test in the next two weeks. The children looked at an existing example of a fruit catching game to see how different sprites had been coded so that they behaved differently and how they were associated with different scores. Year 6 then worked in pairs to select sprites they would use in their own original games. They decided which would score points, how many points they were worth and which sprites would take points away.
