'Magic Moments'

F2 – We have read 'The Invisible String' this week and have shared the family, friends and pets their own 'invisible strings' are connected to. It was wonderful to hear some F2 children include their Year 6 buddies in their lists of who is most special to them. We have also introduced our **kindness** tree which will grow a new leaf every time we see **our school value of kindness** in action.

Year 1 – In Year 1 this week we have enjoyed exploring our new book, making predictions and taking part in role play. We have also been developing our balancing skills, learning how to jump and land safely on two feet without wobbling.

Year 2 – This week we have started our Read to Write unit based on the book A River. We 'stepped into the cover' and went exploring the rainforest near the river. We had to think about how we were moving so we were respectful and didn't wake up any of the animals in there. Following this we had a go at writing an alliteration poem about the animals in the rainforest.







Year 3 – This week Year 3 investigated friction and how different surfaces can change the speed of an object. We looked at prehistoric art with Mrs Ainslie and loved going outside to collect natural materials to paint with. We made our own paints using spices to replicate the colours used in cave paintings.

Year 4 – This week, we have been looking at art by Barbara Hepworth, who created abstract sculptures. We were inspired to create our own sculptures by designing and carving into bars of soap. Thank you to parents for helping us out with sending soap in for this.

Year 5 – This week we have been talking about how important it is to have the **motivation** to learn something new. Whether that is 'Power of 10' in maths, or learning to ride a bike on the roads safely. Well done Year 5!

Year 6 – Year 6 gained further experience at building circuits and representing them through accurate scientific diagrams using the correct symbols. The children enjoyed using circuit kits to accomplish this. They also exemplified our school value of **motivation** as they were pushed to apply their knowledge by completing some scientific problem-solving tasks.
