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'Magic Moments'

F2 - During National Storytelling Week, F2 entered into the enchanting world of the traditional tale Goldilocks and the Three Bears. As well as getting to savour the taste of honey, the children explored alternative story versions and animatedly acted out the narrative. They displayed their creativity as they drew imaginative maps, complete with traps and magical tales, detailing the Three Bears' quest to find Goldilocks.



Year 1 – This week Year 1 have been squealing with delight as they have watched the seeds that they planted start to grow. The excitement in the morning as they check their seeds has been glorious to witness. We have also been weaving in our Art lessons and found that this is trickier that we expected.

Year 2 – This week we have been thinking about how to stay safe online during our PSHE lesson. We read a story about Smartie the Penguin, who made the right choices to speak to his mum and dad about things that were on his tablet. We then created posters about how to stay safe online. We even learnt a little song to remind us 'Before you tap and click. Remember to stop and think. Tell someone'.

Year 3 – We have continued learning about fractions this week, learning rules to find fractions of amounts. We have also learnt about the Great Pyramids of Giza for our history topic which gave us the chance to make our own 3D pyramid in our Maths lesson.

Year 4 – This week, we have been reading poetry and trying to decipher what is happening in each poem. We read about spiders' webs, icicles and flowers dressed up as metaphors and then looked at a riddle poem called 'Who' and found clues that directed us to conclude it was about an owl.

Year 5 – We have been exploring our 'Living things and their habitats' topic in Science through a live BBC lesson on Sharks this week. The children were able to identify the differences between a shark's life cycle and an insect, or human. There were some very brave children who said they would like to dive with sharks one day! The most interesting fact we discovered when researching a shark's life cycle is that they are born with a full set of teeth so they can eat the other eggs!

Year 6 – This week, Year 6 continued to work on website design as part of our computing work this half term. In this week's session, Year 6 added subpages to their website so that next week they can start to link their subpages to their homepage. The children used their plans from earlier in the half term to inform their work so far.




