'Magic Moments'

F2 - Our magic moment this week was most certainly our first stay and play session! It was wonderful to welcome so many parents and carers into F2 and see the children share their favourite resources, activities and games. We even had some parents trying out our mini stilts and our obstacle course and dressing as super heroes! We can't wait for our next stay and play session!

Year 1 – This week we have enjoyed making our 'Trees of Life' in Art, using different papers and folding and rolling them in different ways. We have also been practising rolling balls to each other in PE and trying to make sure that they go where we want them to - much harder than it sounded!

Year 2 – This week in our writing lessons we have been editors and publishers. We had a special publishing paper with our animal that we have written an information text about. I have learnt so much about animals of the rainforest from our class!

Year 3 – This week, we learnt all about Dr Thomas Barnardo and the lengths he went to improve the lives of children in need. Some of us were surprised at the poor conditions some children were living in during the

Victorian times. We also enjoyed using an Atlas to find and name famous rivers around the world. We had an exciting time visiting the Liverpool World Museum to learn more about the Ancient Egyptians.
Year 4 – This week, we have been learning about how sounds are made in science. We investigated how we could make instruments create a sound before experimenting with rice on drums, tuning forks in water and coat hangers with string to attach to our fingers. We found that vibrations are needed for sound to be created.
Year 5 – We have been exploring our survival guide in more depth; this week in our writing, we have been creating a survival tin with essentials to living in the wilderness. We began our topic of North and South America and studied the major environmental regions including the Amazon Rainforest, the Great Plains and the Rocky Mountains.

Year 6 – This week, Year 6 continued their comparison of London, Athens and Jamaica as part of our geography topic. The class looked closely at all three locations and identified similarities and differences linked to physical geography. They thought about which locations have major rivers, which are mountainous, which are islands or peninsulas and which hemisphere all of the locations are found in.

Eco News: This week I would like to say a huge well done to all of the children and adults in The Base. They have been celebrating Earth Day in school and created lots of excellent resources. Last Friday after school, they took part in a school litter pick. I will make sure they all get a certificate next week in celebration assembly! Thank you, Miss Ramejkis.
